



- Voters must be registered by Feb. 13 and request a mail ballot by March 3.
- Mail ballots must be received by March 19 at 7PM local time.



Florida

- Voters must be registered with a party to participate in that party's primary vote.
- Voters must be registered by Feb. 20 and request a mail ballot by March 7 at 5PM local time.
- Mail ballots must be received by March 19 at 7PM local time.

Illinois

- Voters can choose which party primary vote to participate in. They cannot choose more than one.
- Voters must be registered by Feb. 20 and request a mail ballot by March 14 (recommended to do so earlier to allow for mailing time).
- Mail ballots should be postmarked by March 19 and received by April 2.

Kansas

- If you are registered with a party, you may only vote in that party's primary election. Non-party affiliated voters can vote in the primary and must choose one party ballot when they vote.
- Voters must be registered and request a mail ballot by Feb. 20.
- Mail ballots must be received by March 19 at 7PM local time.



Ohio

- Voters can choose which party primary vote to participate in. They cannot choose more than one.
- Voters must be registered by Feb. 20 and request a mail ballot by March 12.
- Mail ballots should be postmarked by March 19 and received by March 23.
